IMMERSE's first Dissemination Event will take place in Cork on September 15th

- University College Cork will host the event and share their findings on migrant and refugee children integration in Ireland.
- The event will be live-streamed on the project's YouTube channel, @IMMERSE_H, at 10.00 hours (GMT+1).

University College Cork will hold an event on September 15th to share the Immerse H2020 project's findings on the integration of migrant and refugee children in the Irish education system. The event will take place at the UCC premises with the participation of The Institute for Social Science in the 21st Century.

A **panel of children and young people** involved in the project will participate in the conference sharing their experience and their perspective. Educators and researchers will complete the speakers' line to showcase different approaches to the migrant and refugee children's integration through the education system.
